The Impact of the Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch-up Premium at The Sweyne Park School 2015/16

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading and/or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). There were 17 pupils that were below level 4 in reading and 26 pupils were below level 4 in maths.

During 2015/16 the school received £19,000 to support these pupils. This funding was used for:

- Enhancing additional adult support in lower sets for English and maths lessons.
- 1:1 tuition for individual support in literacy and/or numeracy.
- Setting up and running a paired reading scheme.
- Supporting transition from Year 6 to Year 7

Impact

100% of those pupils who had attained below level 4 in literacy at KS2, were making expected progress or above at the end of Year 7.

81% of those pupils who had attained below level 4 in numeracy at KS2, were making expected progress or above at the end of Year 7 for numeracy. The remaining 19% of this cohort made between 1 to 2 fine levels of progress and they will be monitored closely throughout Year 8.
